

# Graffiti Removal Indemnity Agreement

**Please read the below information prior to completing and returning the indemnity agreement below.**

## **What is an Indemnity Agreement?**

An indemnity agreement is an agreement where one party agrees to protect another party against any claims or losses.

## **Why may I wish to complete this Graffiti Indemnity Agreement?**

Hull City Council (“the Council”) is working to remove graffiti from your neighbourhood to improve the quality of you and your family’s life.

If you are unable to remove graffiti from your property the Council may be in a position to offer you assistance with its removal (please note that, depending on the location, type and amount of graffiti involved, a charge may be applied). If you wish to contact the Council to discuss how it may help, please complete and return the indemnity form.

## **Who can complete this Graffiti Indemnity Agreement?**

To take advantage of this service you must be either the owner of the property or, in the case of an occupier of rented or leased accommodation, have authority from the owner of the property concerned to request this work to be done. Completed forms must be sent:

## **What will happen once I have returned a completed Graffiti Indemnity Agreement?**

On receipt of a completed indemnity form the Council will contact you to discuss whether it is in a position to arrange the removal of graffiti from your property.

You may be asked whether you have any paint that matches the effected area, and whether you can make this available for use, otherwise the graffiti will be painted out in a standard colour that is available to the Council on that date of such works.

The Council wishes to emphasise that it is not always possible to remove all signs of graffiti completely from property, but promises that it will take every effort to do so.

## **What should I do if I know who did the graffiti, or is doing this elsewhere in Hull?**

Anyone able to identify those responsible for graffiti in Hull, should contact the Council on 01482 300300 or Humberside Police on 0845 6060 222 immediately.

With your help we will be able to target those criminals responsible, improve the quality of life for you and your family and protect communities.
